

WJ MULLEN, BG USA, RETIRED Honorary Colonel, Second Infantry Regiment

The Second Infantry Regiment has served our Nation with distinction for many generations. The Regiment's reputation for excellence was established by every soldier ever assigned to the Regiment. It is a pleasure to report that the Regiment will continue that service and, that the history of that service will be permanently and publicly commemorated.

First, the Regiment's 2d Battalion will return to the Army's Order of Battle early in 2015. The timing of this event is auspicious because the activation will occur approximately two hundred years since the "new" Second Infantry Regiment was formed in the Spring of 1815. Plans and actions to "stand up" 2-2 Infantry at Fort Polk as part of the 10th Infantry Division in 2015 are in progress. It is wonderful that there will be a new generation of Ramrod infantrymen to build on the legacy that all of us veterans entrusted to those who followed us. These new Ramrodders will write their own chapter in our Regiment's glorious history and will add their own laurels to the Regiment's reputation. The Association will keep us all informed about the Activation and related details.

Second, our Association has commissioned a monument to the Second Infantry Regiment to be erected at Fort Benning, Georgia, the Home of the Infantry. The monument will be on the National Infantry Museum's Walk of Honor. It will be a permanent testimony to the legacy we inherited when we joined the Regiment, as well as, the history we lived and the legacy we left. The design will include provisions to allow updating as the Regiment continues to protect our Nation. It is especially appropriate that our monument will be close to the Museum itself which contains the Second Infantry Regiment Mezzanine and its tribute to the soldiers and families of the Regiment and, for us Viet Nam veterans, that the replica of the Viet Nam Wall is nearby.

The next Society of the First Infantry Division will take place 17 - 21 June, 2015, in Lombard, IL. This reunion should be especially memorable because of the opportunity to be with friends during our Association's reunion, and the opportunity to visit the First Division Museum and the McCormick Estate. Plan for it. I hope that you are there.

A Personal Note

Two of my friends from Charlie Company, 1-2 Infantry, died recently. Joe Foy and John Carlisle were terrific soldiers and important parts of the Second Infantry and, my life. Our relationship began in Viet Nam and continued when I began to attend Division reunions.

Joe was my Supply Sergeant in Viet Nam. He kept us supplied with what we needed when we were in the field, made sure that the "Cambo Camp" was ready for us when we returned from the jungle, and he kept me out of trouble. In later years his stories were a continuous source of amusement. Joe was a fixture at the Division, as well as, the Pigeon Forge reunions. He was the rock upon which we began to pull together the core of Charlie Company veterans who now regularly attend the reunions. It seems fitting that Joe's fatal heart attack occurred during the last Division reunion, when he was with the veterans and wives who meant so much to him.

John Carlisle was a combat infantryman in the best sense of the title. I know no higher praise. I came to know John and Alicia Carlisle in the years since I retired from the Army. John had a successful career as a lawyer and a businessman. He and Alicia raised a wonderful family. They were generous contributors to the closeness of the Charlie Company veterans. Just prior to the successful deployment of 2-2 Infantry to Afghanistan, LTC Lopez arranged for and moderated a panel discussion on resiliency to help mentally prepare his soldiers for their deployment and combat. The panel was composed of Second Infantry Regiment combat veterans, three presently assigned to the battalion and three from Viet Nam. John was one of the three. His comments, particularly pertinent and well-articulated, were complimented by LTC Lopez for their impact.

Greetings from Fort Polk, Louisiana, and the soon-to-be new home of the RAMRODS of 2-2 Infantry! My name is SGM Chris Lewis, and I will be the Operations Sergeant Major for 2-2 IN once we begin standing up the unit later this year. The incoming Battalion CSM, SGM Tom Abbott, is already here at Polk, and is on temporary assignment as the CSM for the Live Fire Committee for the Joint Readiness Training Center (JRTC), which is also located here. SGM Abbott and myself are honored and excited to be able to continue the great legacy and traditions of the Ramrods, as they become part of the 4th Brigade Combat Team, 10th Mountain Division.

According to the current plan, 2-2 IN will start to take shape in December/January, with Company Command teams being established. The Battalion headquarters, barracks, motor pool, and the tremendous amount of equipment, vehicles, weapons, and supplies will begin to fall into place as Soldiers begin to be assigned to 2-2 IN in early spring of 2015. Our higher headquarters, the 4th Brigade Combat Team, 10th Mountain Division, will reflag to 3rd Brigade, 10th Mountain Division, in March/April 2015, with the Ramrods of 2-2 IN uncasing our colors soon afterwards. No specific time has been set yet for the uncasing ceremony, but best guess would put it in April-May-June timeframe of next year. I'll be sure to let you all know as early as possible, as we'd love to have the veterans of the 2nd Infantry Regiment here for the ceremony.

A special thanks goes to CPT Sowder & the 2-2 IN Provisional staff at Fort Knox, for completing a successful transfer of the 2-2 IN artifacts from the BN HQ at Fort Knox to here at Fort Polk a few weeks ago. Everything arrived well packaged and in good order, and I'm thoroughly enjoying reading and learning of the unique history of the 2nd Infantry Regiment.

As more information develops on the standing up of 2-2 IN here at Polk, I'll be sure to post it on the message board on the Association website. My contact information is also listed on the website, and would be more than happy to hear from the veterans of the 2nd Infantry Regiment anytime, or answer any questions or concerns you may have.

On behalf of SGM Abbott and myself, we are both honored to be part of the next chapter in the history of the RAMRODS, and we hope to see you here at Fort Polk when the colors of 2-2 Infantry are uncased next year!



The activities since our last report were as follows:



SECOND US INFANTRY REGIMENT ASSOCIATION

2D BATTALION, 2D INFANTRY REASSIGNMENT

The announcement of the 2d Battalion being slated to be activated with the 10th Mountain Division may be upsetting to some, however, it is not the first time that the regiment or battalions of the regiment have been assigned to a unit other than the 1st Infantry Division.

Since the establishment of permanent divisions during World War I the 2d Infantry Regiment, which consisted of three battalions with 4 companies each, had been assigned as follows; assigned to the 19th Division from September 1918 to February 1919, the 6th Division from March 1923 to October 1939 and the 5th Division from October 1939 until June 1957, during the period September 1946 through May, 1954 the regiment had been inactivated and activated on three occasions. Also during the period from 1916 to 1922 the following occurred; August 1916, 250 officers and 465 enlisted were transferred to the newly formed 32d Infantry Regiment. August 1918, one half of the regiment is reassigned to the 88th Infantry Regiment. October 1921 the 2d and 3rd Battalions are eliminated leaving only Headquarters and the 1st Battalion. August 1922 the 2d and 3rd Battalions are organized using personnel from the 54th Infantry Regiment. June 1957 ended the 2d Infantry being an actual regiment and from then on it has been two individual battalions.

The 1st Battalion, 2nd Infantry was inactivated in June 1957 until February 1962 when the battalion was activated with the 5th Infantry Division at Fort Devens, Mass. In July 1965 it was reassigned to the 1st Infantry Division at Fort Devens, Mass. The 1st Battalion remained with the 1st Infantry Division until it was inactivated in October 1983. In March 2008 the battalion was activated with the 172d Infantry Brigade in Germany. In June 2013 the battalion was inactivated and remains inactive.

Following the elimination of the regimental system and the creation of the Pentomic Organization the 2nd Battalion, 2nd Infantry was reassigned to the 1st Infantry Division at Fort Riley, Kan. in June 1957 and designated the 2nd Battle Group, 2nd Infantry. In January 1959 the unit was reassigned to the 24th Infantry Division in Germany. In February 1962 the unit was re-designated a battalion and transferred to the 5th Infantry Division at Fort Devens, Mass. and in July 1965 was reassigned to the 1st Infantry Division. In April 1970 the battalion was inactivated. In March 1973 the battalion was activated with the 9th Infantry Division at Fort Lewis, Wash. until it was inactivated in May 1991. In February 1996 that battalion was activated with the 1st Infantry Division in Germany and remained so until this year when it was again inactivated. The battalion was not active from May 2006 to April 2007 during the period it was reassigned to the United States.

From the end of the regimental system in June 1957 there has not been an active 3d Battalion.

Since its formation the regiment or companies of the regiment have been located in 39 states, Washington DC and 16 foreign countries, and in some instances more than once.

KARL R. JOHNSON 2ND INFANTRY REGIMENT 1944 – 1946

In November of 1944, 2LT Karl Johnson, reported in to the 3^{rd} Battalion, 2^{nd} Infantry Regiment somewhere in the vicinity of Ft. Driant, France. Like so many young men, he had no idea the impact combat would have on his life. He also did not realize at the time what the 2^{nd} Infantry Regiment would come to mean to him.

I'm the son of Karl Johnson. Your esteemed Association President recently asked me to provide some information on my father for this newsletter. As a few of you know, I'm assisting the leadership of the Association in the pursuit of a memorial to the 2nd Infantry at the National Infantry Museum. I could not be prouder to assist in this noble cause.

My father was barely 22 years old when he took charge of his platoon in I Company. As most of you know the regiment was assigned to the 5th Infantry Division throughout the war and fought through France, Luxemburg, Belgium, and Germany ultimately spending their final days in Czechoslovakia. My dad led two platoons, was awarded the Silver Star for actions in the Ardennes as well as the Bronze Star Medal and CIB. Returning to Camp Campbell, KY most members of the regiment spent their final days in the Army and mustered out. This included my father. Eighteen months later he was offered a commission in the Air Force. He would remain in the Air Force until his retirement as a Lt. Col. in 1966.

From my earliest memories of my dad telling me of his service during the war, the conversation always turned to the 2nd Infantry Regiment and his many friends. Despite the horrors of war that he undoubtedly experienced, the friendships he made in 1944 would remain with him long after the war. His mentor was his Battalion Commander, just a few years older than him. His very best friend was a fellow platoon leader, who I later called my "Uncle Phil." In the mid - 1980s he reconnected with his Battalion Commander BG (Ret.) Robert Connor and was invited to a reunion. At that point forward he began to support the Association in a variety of positions to include Secretary/ Treasurer and President. He organized many reunions over the years but was most proud when the 2nd Infantry was reactivated within the 9th ID and later in the 1st ID in Germany. While many of you were in the far off jungles of Vietnam and later in Iraq and Afghanistan, his heart was with you.

Continuing the legacy of the 2nd Infantry Regiment wasn't simply something to keep busy with in retirement. It became his passion. He organized the last reunion a few years before he died. It consisted of only three remaining members of the WWII Association. One of his hardest tasks was packaging up the Association's colors, membership lists etc. and dropping them in the mail. Were he alive today I'm certain he would be very proud not only of the current members of the Regiment but all of you in the present – day 2nd Infantry Association. He would certainly challenge every one of you to continue to strengthen the important legacy of the Regiment. What you leave behind will be an important reminder of your courage, commitment and most importantly the sacrifice of those who did not return.


